Not Just Stones

"... you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ."

- 1 Peter 2:5

READ

1 Peter 2:5, 1 Corinthians 6:19a, 1 Corinthians 3:16, Ephesians 2:20



Because Jesus Christ is called the Living One, Christians are not supposed to be merely stones but *living stones*. The early Christians reading 1 Peter 2:5 knew that they were to be different from both the temples in Jerusalem and the temples of false gods that consisted of dead stones. Instead, they were to be part of the spiritual temple of God – a house of prayer and worship. Did you know that God has chosen to live in you? Are you the kind of stone that is part of God's building?

REFLECT



According to Ephesians 2:20, upon whose foundation should we all be built?

RESPOND



- Recall a situation where God has granted you the grace to live in a manner set apart for Him. How did it make you feel? Express it to God through prayer.
- Do you exemplify a life of worship and prayer? If not, what do you think should you do?

DAY 2

Not Just A Prophet

"But this is not true of my servant Moses; he is faithful in all my house.."

- Numbers 12:7

Numbers 12:7, Hebrews 3:2



In all of Israel's history, there had been no prophet of God as intimate with God as Moses was. He was both a servant and steward – faithfully obeying everything that God commanded him to the last detail. God has been revealing Himself to different people in history but not in the way He revealed Himself to Moses whom he spoke with face to face. God still reveals Himself to us today and He is looking for those who are faithful in His house.

REFLECT



Centuries later, in Hebrews 3:1-2, we find a man as faithful as Moses. Who was he and what did he faithfully do?

RESPOND



- Recall an instance when God had been faithful to you. How did it impact your life? Share this with your prayer partner.
- In what areas is God leading you to be faithful?

DAY 3

Not Just Your House

"You expected much, but see, it turned out to be little... Why?" declares the LORD Almighty. "Because of my house, which remains a ruin, while each of you is busy with his own house."

- Haggai 1:9

Haggai 1:9, Deuteronomy 28:38-45, Matthew 6:33



The prophet Haggai delivered God's sharp rebuke to the people of Judah. They lacked concern for the house of the Lord because they were busy building and beautifying their homes. This was an indicator of their priorities. Because they did not put God in the *first place*, His blessings were withheld. Like Judah, we also have different priorities: money, academics, career, family, leisure activities or other things. Where do we place God in our list of priorities?

REFLECT



Make a list of the top three things you spend money and time on.
